## I. Call the Meeting to Order – 7:03 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Committee Chair Susan Dunnell.

## II. Approval of Minutes

1. Regular Meeting – August 21, 2012: Motion to approve the minutes was made by Mr. Calnan and seconded by Ms. Valcourt. On a vote of 5-0-1, with Mrs. Ducey abstaining, the motion passed.

Chair Susan Dunnell paused the meeting for a moment of silence in remembrance of Jim Boyd, former principal in Hudson for over 30 years. Mr. Calnan shared stories of Jim's life and his many accomplishments.

## III. **Superintendent's Report** - Dr. Lyons reported:

<u>Opening of School</u>: Opening day for instructional staff was held on August 28<sup>th</sup>, with students arriving on August 29<sup>th</sup>. The students were happy and energetic and the staff was ready for them.

<u>Buildings and Grounds</u>: Dr. Lyons thanked the Buildings and Grounds Department for their hard work during the summer getting the schools ready.

Len Belli updated the Committee on summer projects highlights that were completed, including the following:

- painting at the High School
- painting at Forest
- new flooring in six classrooms at Forest
- renovations of the library at Farley
- new roof at Farley
- air conditioning work at the nurse's station at Farley
- early abatement work was done at J.F.K.

During the staff opening day, Dr. Lyons thanked the custodians and acknowledged their hard work and staff also recognized the custodians for all they do.

Also on staff opening day, Dr. Elizabeth Englander gave her presentation on Antibullying. It was very well received.

<u>Food Services</u>: Dr. Lyons also noted that Whitson's Food Company began service in the schools. Overall, it went very well. The Whitson's website is now up and running.

Dr. Lyons then updated the Committee that the Food Services Contract has been approved by the attorneys and Whitson's. The contract is now back with Finance Director, Patty Lange, who is editing the agreed changes and packaging a number of materials that will be forwarded to the DESE. DESE will now approve the contract to ensure that it meets all nutritional laws and regulations. The contract will then come back to School Committee for approval.

<u>Home and School</u>: Dr. Lyons thanked the Home and School Association for the new staff members welcome baskets which they provided during the three-day orientation program.

<u>Transportation</u>: Bus transportation went very well. There are always a few issues at the start of school, but we are very pleased with R.L. McCarthy Bus Company.
