Leadership Team Update

Budget

The Leadership Team has turned its attention to the crafting of budget recommendations for the School Committee. Dr. Fortuna and Executive Director of Finance and Operations, Patricia Lange held individual meetings with all administrators regarding their budget needs for FY17. On Tuesday, October 27, 2015, the Leadership Team met to develop consensus around the budget recommendations that would be forwarded to the Committee during the upcoming budget meetings.

Dr. Fortuna thanked the administrative team for their thoughtfulness in their presentations. The budget recommendations that will be forwarded to the School Committee truly represent positions and materials that is needed for students.

Finance and Operations

Budget

In addition to developing budget recommendations and documents for FY17, Patty Lange has been working closely with Elaine Gratton and the Town to complete the "Year End Report" for FY15, which is a time consuming cooperative effort between the District and the town.

Dr. Fortuna thanked Patty and Elaine for their efforts on this mammoth project, and noted that they will attend a School Committee meeting in December to present the year-end report to the Committee, as well as the results of a recent student activities account audit.

Curriculum and Instruction Update

Technology Professional Learning

On Wednesday, October 21, Hudson High School staff members Ryan Dailey, Rebekah Whitesel, Kate Cellucci, Erin Learned, Eric Ahearn, and Ellen Schuck attended the Annual Project Lead The Way Conference at WPI. Ryan Dailey presented the work the High School's Project Lead The Way teachers have been doing to ensure Hudson students have a consistent practice and expectations for their engineering notebooks.

MassCUE Conference:

On Thursday, October 22, 2015, Hudson High School staff members Rolf Wasserman, Meghan Gasek, Linsey Colarullo, Danielle Spilotros, Pamela Mark, Allison Rozet, Laura Bettina, Lynda Chilton, and Ellen Schuck attended the Annual MassCUE Conference at Gillette Stadium. Members attended a variety of workshops which focused on incorporating a variety of technology resources into their curriculum.

School Visits

Dr. Fortuna shared an interesting observation made during these visits as she traveled across two different elementary schools in one day. In both schools, she observed first grade classrooms and saw the same math concept/lesson being presented in each classroom where math instruction was taking place, and witnessed each teacher as responsive to the needs of the children in front of her, but it was clear that the learning

expectation was the same for the first grade students in Hudson, something that would not have been observable three years ago.

Dr. Fortuna recognized the teachers and leaders for their outstanding work that they are doing to provide the best educational experience possible to our children.

Superintendent's Items of Interest

Superintendent's Advisory Council – Monday, October 26th

The first Superintendent's Advisory Council Meeting was held on Monday October 26th. Representatives from all five schools were present. Dr. Fortuna noted that this continues to be one of her favorite standing meetings. This year, the group brought forth an extensive list of issues that they would like to discuss, including but not limited to:

- 4th grade band
- Curricular consistency and consistency of expectations between teachers
- Standard-based report cards
- World Language Instruction

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The group will also be discussing the budget and progress on our District Improvement Plan.

Dr. Fortuna invited all to attend the next meeting on Monday, November 23rd from 5:30 to 7:00 p.m. in the School Committee Room at the Administration Building.

Boston College Principalship Advisory Council – Tuesday, October 27th

Dr. Fortuna was asked by the Dean of the Lynch School of Education to participate on the Boston College Principalship Advisory Council (BCPAC). Boston College views the BCPAC as providing a valuable service to Boston College and the greater educational community in the region. The purpose of the group is to provide feedback for the ongoing improvement of Boston College Educational Leadership program.

As an active member of this council, Dr. Fortuna will be asked by the faculty of the Educational Leadership Program to review curriculum, instructional models, and practicum experiences. In addition, BCPAC members will help faculty interpret longitudinal data about the professional performance of Boston College program graduates.

Committee Chair, Jennifer O'Brien, congratulated Dr. Fortuna on her appointment and thanked her for representing Hudson Public Schools and being part of such an important council.

Quinn Mural Presentation – Wednesday, October 28th

The Quinn Middle School unveiled the school's new outside mural. The group gathered inside the Quinn lobby where they shared the meaning of the new mural and how it came to be, as well as an inside collage of student work depicting their person interpretations of the values of the school that are so beautifully painted in the outside mural.

The outside of the building reflects the values promoted within the Quinn Middle School: Honesty, Respect, Empathy & Courage, and the Quinn community views this mural as a meaningful symbol of their efforts and what they stand for as a middle school.

Dr. Fortuna thanked all who attended the Quinn Middle School Mural unveiling, former principal Brian Daniels, representatives from the architecture firm, Cultural Council member Barbara Worrest, School Committee Member, Allyson Hay and Selectman John Parent.

Dr. Fortuna also thanked art teacher Lisa O'Brien for creating and painting outside mural and art teacher Diane Hoff for conceptualizing and working with students to develop the complementary collage on the inside of the school.

Haunted Physics Lab- October 28th

Dr. Fortuna thanked Physics teachers Bekah Whitesel and Reed Prior and Special Education teacher Paul D'Allessandro on a successful Haunted Physics Lab. The students were extremely well-prepared and offered thoughtful, kid-friendly explanations of complex physics concepts, all for the benefit of our community and the Hudson Food Pantry.

First Steps in Rebuilding the Special Education Parent Advisory Council

The membership drive was held on Thursday, October 22, 2015 at Forest Avenue Elementary School. Seven parents attended and spoke about what they wanted the Special Education Parent Advisory Council to be like. The next meeting will be held on Thursday, November 5, 2015.

The agenda for the November 5th meeting is to review the by-laws and continued discussion of building the Special Education Parent Advisory Council.

The Basic Rights presentation has been scheduled for Thursday, November 12th.

Enrollment
