 - 1. School Improvement Plan and Instructional Leadership Team Presentation

Dr. Rodrigues informed that committee that the principals of each school would be giving updates on their School Improvement Plans and Instructional Leadership Teams.

Ms. Melissa Provost, Farley Elementary School principal presented the following School Improvement Plan updates:

Goal #1: Farley's Instructional Focus is #explainyourbrain Will work with the Instructional Leadership Team in August to create a draft of the School Improvement plan for next year.

Goal #2: Capacity of staff to use data to inform instruction. Completed a deep analysis of MCAS subgroups that performed below meeting expectations. All staff looked at the data to identify gaps and had planned instructional strategies to fill these gaps. Building a culture of data inquiry is in progress. Through the Instructional Leadership Team we will be looking at how we develop and identify assessments.

Goal #3: Staff engaging in high quality practices increase the likelihood of positive social emotional outcomes for every child. Current practices in Social Emotional Learning were reviewed with staff. Developed a working list of things staff can use in the moment in the classroom. Through MTSS, there will be a discussion on tiers of support

Goal #4: Providing staff and students opportunities to engage in 1:1 technology Completed implementation of STEAM (Science, Technology,

Engineering, Art, and Mathematics). This will continue this year with grade 4.

Provided Additional Professional Development for staff on the use of 1:1 technology.

Ms. Provost spoke about her experience with the Instructional Leadership Team over the course of the year. Discussion ensued on Professional Development on trauma.

Mr. David Champigny principal at Forest Avenue Elementary presented the following School Improvement Plan updates:

Goal #1: Created a very high functioning Instructional Leadership Team. School wide instructional focus of "show what you know" was created. Professional Development for year 2 of implementation has been identified.

Goal #2: Revise and reintroduce Leaves of Citizenship so that

100% of staff participate in the program. This has been the most successful year of the program. There has been Professional Development on leaves of citizenship at every staff meeting. Currently, data is being tracked on the frequency of leaves distributed. The compilation of data is in progress.

Goal #3: Bridge the technology gap in grade 3 in preparation for 2019 MCAS testing.

Provide students with meaningful opportunities to learn how to use and practice with technology. He explained that through integration block the students worked to get students comfortable with the chromebooks. This coming year should be even better since the students will have their chromebooks.

Goal #4: Build a culture that promotes equity among staff Homegrown survey produced baseline data. Development of school values and norms is in progress.

Discussion ensued about translating work from this year to the future years.

Ms. Kelly Sardella principal of Mulready Elementary School presented the following School Improvement Plan updates:

Goal #1: Create a High Functioning Instructional Leadership Team The team has written their instructional focus, which will be released soon. Professional development needs have been identified for implementation. She remarked on the positive experience this has been.

Goal #2: Review and revise IST (Instructional Support Team) procedures. New format was developed which had much success with respect to results when testing students.

Goal #3: Ensure there is an environment where children feel empathetic towards others. Some of the activities to support this were :

- Disability awareness month
- Every month there is a focus on authors from different parts of the world
- Cultural night

Goal #4: Each grade level will integrate more technology into their curriculum. The full time technology teacher allows Mulready to accomplish this.

Mr. Jason Webster, principal of Quinn Middle School, presented the following School Improvement Plan updates

Goal #1: Establish a high functioning Instructional Leadership Team

Identify school wide instructional focus

Create targeted Professional Development plan and evidence based practices.

This year there is common planning time so teachers can meet as teams and/or departments.

Goal #2: Research and identify social emotional curricular Build and foster positive relationships between staff and students. There has been work with S3 and a curriculum (Kindness in the Classroom)

Goal #3: Cycle of refinement for the new STEM and humanities courses. This was examined with the development of the new schedule at Quinn.

Goal #4: To begin the process of developing a culture that promotes equity

Mr. Jonathan Bourn, interim principal of Hudson High School, provided the following School Improvement Plan updates:

Goal #1: Establish a high functioning building level Instructional Leadership Team

Basic meeting norms were established early on and include minutes, newsletters, and a school wide instructional focus of perseverance

Goal #2: create a working draft of Vision of the Graduate Internal version has been accomplished. Draft has been reviewed at the school level and needs to be shared at the district level.

Goal #3: Create a professional and community learning culture that embraces differences.

Goal #4: Revise and optimize the Master schedule for the 2019-2020 school year. The schedule met most goals for class size numbers.

Mr. Bourn commended the staff at the High School for their work.

Mr. Smith asked when the committee would be able to see the Vision of the Graduate. Discussion ensued

2. Receipt of petition to name the Hudson High School Library to honor former teacher Susan Menanson

Ms. Jen Wallingford presented the request to rename the Hudson High School Library. She explained that they have submitted the petition with 160 signatures and several testimonies.

Mr. Maston explained there would be a buildings and ground subcommittee to evaluate this request. Mr. Smith, Ms. Weksner, and Mr. Maston will serve on this subcommittee. He informed Ms. Wallingford that there would be a time scheduled for the public hearing with the subcommittee.

 - 1. Approval of Superintendent's End of Year Evaluation Mr. Maston provided some background on the process for the Superintendent's evaluation. He stated that the Committee is mandated to follow and use the state rubric. Using the state provided rubric, each member of the committee was given the opportunity to provide feedback. The document presented is the aggregate as compiled by the superintendent's evaluation subcommittee.

Mr. Maston went through each of the goals and both Dr. Rodrigues' self evaluation and the committee's rating for each of them. Mr. Maston read the committee comments.

He then went through the standards on the evaluation and gave a rating for each of the standards. He then read some of the committee members' comments.

An overall rating of a summative performance rating of proficient was given.

Discussion ensued on the opportunities for improvement identified and how progress on these could be monitored in the next evaluation.

A motion to approve the Superintendent's end of year evaluation was made by Ms. Tousignant Dufour and seconded by Mr. McDowell. On a vote of 5-0-1, with Ms. Weksner abstaining, the motion passed.

Discussion ensued about moving the timing of the evaluation cycle and trying to get the evaluation done before the election in May so all members have a chance to have a voice.

- Approval of Superintendent's FY20 Salary Adjustment Chairman Maston noted that in the process of reviewing the superintendent's performance, the committee recommended a 1% increase in salary for FY20. A motion to increase the superintendent's salary by 1% for FY20 was made by Mr. Smith and seconded by Ms. Michele Tousignant. On a vote of 6-0 the motion passed.
- 3. Approval of School Committee Assignments Dr. Rodrigues made note of the need for a School Committee member on the ELPAC and that there is no longer need for a School Committee member to be a representative on Chaps as a board member.

I. SPECIAL EDUCATION SUMMER SERVICES

Extended School Year (ESY) services provide an extension of the school year special education services for students who are identified as likely to demonstrate substantial regression in learning skills and/or would have substantial difficulty in relearning skills as indicated through data collection and the IEP team process. This summer the District is providing itinerant services such as tutoring, Speech and Language and Physical Therapy at Mulready and Hubert Center. Students who require substantially separate programs are located at Mulready, Farley, Quinn Middle School and Hudson High School.

Overall, about 54 staff members are providing services to approximately 107 Students with Disabilities. Itinerant services began the week of July 8th while the substantially separate programs began the week of July 1st. The new transportation company, First Student, has worked in a collaborative nature to provide transportation for the students who require transportation for their services as part of their IEP. Tanya O'Connell, Assistant Director of Student Services, and Bryan Hauver, ESY Coordinator, continue to work directly with parents and staff to coordinate the services for each student and to ensure that student support services are being delivered at each site.

II. FIRST STUDENT – NEW BUS COMPANY

The summer transportation for the Extended School Year Program had a strong start with the new First Student, the District's new student transportation provider. Parent and Staff feedback has been positive and the bus drivers have been described as being very caring toward the children. In preparation for the opening of schools, we are working with First Student to create the fall bus routes. The first draft is due to the administration next week for review. Active recruiting is currently taking place for bus drivers and for the Hudson dispatcher. To date, six Hudson drivers from North Reading Transportation have moved to First Student. We expect a full complement of bus drivers to service Hudson when school begins, even if the permanent hires are not in place. The wage rates have been raised and there is new guaranteed in the number of hours for drivers to work per day, which the Regional Manager believes will help to attract more candidates. We have arranged for a "Meet and Greet" event which has been scheduled for August 19th for School and District staff to meet the key First Student staff who will be responsible for day to day operations.

III. SCHOOL HOURS OF OPERATION

District families received a reminder on Friday, July 19th of the adjustments in pupil hours for students attending our elementary and middle schools. Two additional reminders are scheduled to be sent to the families on the week of August 1st and on the week of August 19th.

Adjustment to the Elementary Schools Pupil Hours:

The School Committee voted on March 26, 2019 to adjust the start and end times of the three elementary schools in the District. This decision was based on the need to provide adequate time for the school buses to operate between the middle school dismissal and the elementary school dismissals.

Adjustment to the Middle School Pupil Hours:

In response to parents' and teachers' feedback, the District administration established a task force to review and revise the schedule at Quinn Middle School. In order to accommodate the majority of the priority areas identified by the parents and teachers, a redesigned schedule has been created for the middle school that includes the first period of the day starting at 7:47 am. Students are expected to arrive at the building between 7:32 am and 7:47 am.

There was no adjustment to the High School pupil hours.



Matters for Discussion New Business

 Receipt of petition to name the Hudson High School Auditorium to honor former teacher Paul "Skip" Johnson To The Hudson School Committee -

Shakespeare wrote, "All the world's a stage, and all the men and women merely players." One player in particular, Paul "Skip" Johnson, looms large as an influential and guiding figure; promoting, instilling, and impressing the value of performing arts in both the students that were fortunate enough to work with him, and the greater Hudson community as a whole.

For 32 years, Skip led a generation of k-12 students with a pedagogy that was not relegated to mere instruction. Instead, Skip fostered a wholly inclusive community — introducing the performing arts to students of all skill levels, backgrounds, ages, and interests, and granting them new avenues of purpose and self discovery. He worked tirelessly to make sure each and every student reached their full potential. You could say his teachings went far beyond the confines of basic arts curriculum and into a whole person method of learning. It was with this approach that he reached into the hearts of his students.

To the thousands of students Skip taught and mentored, his value cannot be overstated. He provided real knowledge to youthful, hungry minds that wanted more, turning Hudson High School's auditorium unto a sanctuary during class and after hours. Now, years later, there is a hardly a person taught by Skip that wouldn't reflect on him in the most positive of ways. Some would see him as a major influence towards obtaining self-confidence and realization. For others, the prime inspiration in the forging of a lifelong passion. And for many, he was the very role model that not just shaped where they wanted to be professionally, but challenged and encouraged who they ultimately became as individuals.

A vibrant art scene goes hand-in-hand with a vibrant community. Studies have found the exposure to the arts improves test scores, self-efficacy, learning skills, and overall health. The arts create social bonds in communities, and even promotes economic growth and social capital development.

To that end, Skip, along with his wife Lynne Johnson, became leaders within the Hudson community, distinguishing it beginning in 1991, with the Hudson Area Arts Alliance (now the River's Edge Arts Alliance), and its renowned Summer Drama Workshop program. The auditorium they built at the original Hudson High School, both figuratively and in many ways literally (if you count the multiple sets, paintings, and wardrobe building experiences), became the center of their efforts -- bringing forth plays, musicals and concerts to eager audiences young and old. The productions they presented didn't just fill a recreational void, but carved out a culture which has only been amplified by those who once fell under their tutelage.

As time tends to do, Skip's direct contributions have become somewhat of a lingering echo among a new generation and a more modern HHS building. Though he's very much responsible for putting Hudson on the map when it comes to the arts, there are many newcomers to the town who sadly don't know of his name and story. Even more tragic, in recent years, Skip has fallen ill with cancer and is battling every day for his health. In light of this, and even more so for his unparalleled service during his time as an educator, we the undersigned propose to pay tribute to Skip with the naming of the current Hudson High Auditorium. As Shakespeare also wrote, "Mine honor is my life, both grow in one." Given Skip's undeniable lifelong legacy to the town, such a dedication seems only fitting. We ask the Hudson School Committee to consider this proposal, and kindly request to attend a meeting in which further anecdotes and testimonies of Skip's personal and professional successes can be told directly by those who have gained immeasurably because of them. We appreciate the review, and greatly thank you for the time, thought and attention.

The high school administrative team has conducted an annual review of the Student/Parent Handbook and is recommending the following substantive changes. The changes are in the "proposed changes" column below with new language <u>underlined and bolded</u> and deleted language bolded and in red.

Farley Elementary School Student Drop-Off and Pick Up by Parent/Guardian

- Student drop off time begins at 8:20 A.M. Please do not drop off any child/children prior to 8:20 A.M., as there will be no adult supervision. Students who walk may not arrive before 8:20AM.
- All buses, morning and afternoon, will use the front entrance of the building.
- For the safety of your children and other children, we insist no child is dropped off in the parking lot area. All students are to be dropped off curbside, in the drop off zone where the teacher on duty can ensure the safety of every student.
- No vehicle is permitted to park along the curb. If you are walking your child/children in for a particular reason, you must park in a parking space and escort your child. No parent will be allowed to park between the drop off sign and the orange cones in the
- morning. This space is designated for continuous traffic flow only. Do not pass cars that are stopped and in process of dropping off students. If your child has exited your car you must wait until the car(s) in front of you have started exiting from the drop off zone before you can begin to exit and move forward.
- Cars will enter the access road at Packard Street and proceed one way toward gym.
- Drop-Off will be <u>single lane</u>, <u>one way</u> on the access road. Cars will drop off students near the basketball court. A staff member will direct the drop-off.
- Students **must** stay in cars until directed to exit the car by a staff member.
- Cars will proceed slowly, single line, one way behind the school to exit on Cottage Street.
- Please yield to school buses when approaching the exit.
- Students should not be dropped off at Packard Street.

If you regularly pick up your child/children at dismissal, 2:55 P.M., you need to follow the procedures described below:

- You will receive a Parent Pick Up (PPU) form that needs to be completed and returned immediately. All PPU children must have a
 - PPU form on file.
- Once school begins, we will provide you with a laminated paper with the last name, as you would like it to appear. Post this on the passenger window when you pick up your child.
- Parents and/or those persons designated by the parents on the PPU form will drive onto the access road in the back of the school.
- Cars will enter the access road at Packard Street and proceed one way toward the gym.
- Cars may line up on the access road in single line, one way to the end of the gym.
- Do not call to your child to come to the car.
- Students will be released to parents by staff member on duty who will direct the pick-up.
- Cars will proceed slowly, single lane, one-way behind the school to exit on Cottage Street.
- Please **yield** to school buses when approaching the exit.
- Any student remaining after all other cars have departed will go with the teacher on duty to the office. The responsible party will enter the office to pick up their child. 

Parents and families are also encouraged to ask their child why he/she is the proud wearer of a paw print. In addition, the another sticker will be placed on a school-wide sticker chart in the shape of our Farley Fox mascot located in our main office hallway. The school-wide goal is to fill this mascot shape from the bottom. Each day, as students pass, they will see the stickers increase and our exceptional behaviors deeds grow. Every month there will be a whole-school assembly to highlight the stellar attributes of our students.

Forest Avenue's Positive Behavior Mission Statement:

Our mission is to develop a school wide positive behavior support plan that will create and enhance a culture where all members of our school community, staff, students, parents and visitors, exemplify fairness, outstanding citizenship, responsibility, empathy, show respect and trustworthiness.

FOREST AVENUE PROMISE

In order to promote a caring community, we, the students of Forest Avenue School promise to demonstrate: Fairness, Outstanding Citizenship, Responsibility, Empathy, Respect, and Trustworthiness. Through Courage, Honesty, and Perseverance, we hope to create a school community where everyone feels Safe, Respected, and Included.

We here at Forest Avenue School will effectively teach appropriate behavior to all children. When taught, all children can exhibit appropriate behavior. As a result of this belief, it is our responsibility to identify the contextual setting, events, and environmental conditions that allow all students to demonstrate appropriate behavior. Our commitment is to determine and provide the tools and opportunities to actively teach these pro-social behaviors.

The Positive Behavioral Support Team development committee has developed a positive and proactive code of behavioral expectations. The behavioral expectations are developed from information provided by classroom teachers and other members of the school community. These are the expectations that are posted in many classrooms throughout Forest Avenue School, in some cases stated differently. They are as follows:

Behavioral Expectations

F-Fairness:
Everyone has a place in the school community.
Fair means everyone gets what they need to be successful.
O-Outstanding Citizenship:
I will do my share to make the school community better for everyone.
I will build a good reputation for the school community by working together and cooperating.
R-Responsibility:
I will do what I agree to do and always try my best.
I will think about my actions before I act, and I will be held accountable for the choices I make.
E-Empathy:
I will understand that everyone has their own thoughts, feelings, and attitudes.
I will accept that everyone's thoughts, feelings, and attitudes.
I will treat others the way I want to be treated.
I will deal peacefully with anger, insults, and disagreements.

T-Trustworthiness:

I will be honest and do what I say I will do.

I will have the courage to stand by my family, friends, and people in the school community.

Along with the establishment of concrete behavioral expectations, we will teach such behaviors across all school community settings. The students are made aware of the different behavioral expectations they are expected to follow in individual settings throughout the school community. These expectations are actively taught as well as being posted throughout the school community.

The Response to Intervention multitier model allows for Forest Avenue community members to differentiate levels of behaviors and design differentiated interventions. All students are held accountable for demonstrating behaviors that are aligned with the school code of appropriate behavior as stated in the student handbook. In order to discourage inappropriate behaviors, students will be directly taught the Levels of Behaviors and the Levels of Consequences. They are as follows:

LEVEL I BEHAVIORS

Level I behaviors are minor rule violations that will result in an immediate verbal correction with a possible consequence. May include but not limited to:

LEVEL I CONSEQUENCES

Students who engage in Level I behaviors will be asked to identify the inappropriate behavior and describe the appropriate replacement behavior. Students may receive a mild consequence designed to discourage the inappropriate behavior from occurring in the future. Consequences for Level I behaviors may include but are not limited to:

Verbal correction	Apologizing
Loss of privileges	Class meeting
Correction of mistake (cleaning desk, replacing materials, giving items back, complete assignments)	

LEVEL II BEHAVIORS

Level II behaviors are more serious in nature. Level II behaviors will result in an immediate verbal correction, a logical consequence, and a written behavior report that is signed by and discussed with the student's teacher and parent.

Cheating	Destruction of school property such as: doors, walls, carving, electronic equipment
Chronic Level I behavior Three or more times	

LEVEL II CONSEQUENCES

Students who engage in Level II behaviors will be asked to identify the inappropriate behavior and describe the appropriate replacement behavior. The teacher and parent will document the incident using a behavior report form that will be signed and discussed. The student will be responsible for returning the form signed within 24 hours. Consequences for Level II behaviors may include but are not limited to:

Apology	Time out
Verbal correction	Behavioral Contract

<u>LEVEL III BEHAVIORS</u>

Serious fighting, harassment, and verbal abuse violate the dignity, wellbeing, and safety of another person. These behaviors will not be tolerated and will result in possible suspension from school. Other Level III behaviors may result in suspension but may also be corrected using a variety of logical consequences.

Students who engage in Level III behaviors will be referred to the principal for immediate corrective action. After consulting with the parents and appropriate school personnel the principal will issue appropriate consequences and facilitate corrective action designed to help the student improve her/his behavior.

Student Arrival Procedures

Arrival by Bus

Students will be dropped off in front of Forest Avenue Elementary School. A staff member greets each bus and directs the children to enter the building.

Arrival by Car (Student Drop Off)

Drivers will enter from Woodrow Street only and drive through the Woodrow Parking lot towards the back of the school. Drivers will follow along the back of the school and take a right at the far end of the building. Starting at 8:20, students will exit vehicles from the right side of the vehicle only at the Forest Avenue end of the building. Staff members will be there to greet them as they enter the building. Once children have safely exited the car, drivers should take a left and exit the parking onto Forest Avenue.

Arrival By Car (Parent/Guardian Escort)

Parents who wish to escort their child into the building should park their vehicle in the Woodrow Street Lot then walk their student to the main door at the center of the building.

Student Dismissal Procedures

On the first bell at 2:55, all students line up at their bus station. Walkers and pick-ups walk to the cafeteria and line up by the Art room doors to be dismissed to a parent/guardian or to the crosswalk. Drivers will enter from Woodrow Street only and drive through the Woodrow Parking lot towards the back of the school. Drivers will follow along the back of the school and take a right at the far end of the building. Using the number from the placard on the passenger side dashboard, students will be called outside and enter cars on the right side. Once students are safely loaded into cars, drivers may take a left towards Forest Avenue and exit the parking lot at Forest Avenue.

On the second bell, students are dismissed to their bus as it arrives.

If you are picking up a child before 2:55 PM dismissal, please come to the office and your child will be called from class. A note should be sent in notifying the teacher of the early dismissal.

OPEN HOUSE

In September, parents are invited to school for an evening open house. At this event, faculty will conduct grade and classroom- based presentations regarding curriculum and expectations for the school year. Our open house is scheduled for Tuesday, September 17th.

PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

Parent-teacher conferences are scheduled twice each year, in October and April. Reminders are sent out prior to these conferences informing parents of dates and times. However, parents are encouraged not to wait for the regularly scheduled conferences if a problem arises.

Teachers prefer to deal with such instances as soon as possible. Many potential problems can be averted by early action and involvement between parents and the school. Conferences will be scheduled for 15 minute increments. Please be mindful of time and teacher schedules. If you need a translator, please contact the school.

Dates this year are: November 18th and 19th and March 10th and 11th. Evening conferences will be held November 19th and March 11th.

REPORT CARDS

Report cards for grades K-4 are issued three times per year.

The dates are: December 6, 2019 March 20, 2020 Last day of school

DROP-OFF/PICK-UP PROCEDURES

MORNING ARRIVAL

To assist with a smooth drop off procedure, please do not exit your car. Children should practice exiting the car <u>curbside</u> with their school materials prior to the start of school if possible. If you feel your child cannot exit the car independently, please park in the lot and walk your child to the sidewalk.

Morning arrival – buses and cars, front entrance

- Student drop off time begins at 8:20 A.M. Please do not drop off any child/children prior to 8:20 A.M., as there will be no adult supervision. Students who walk may not arrive before 8:20 A.M.
- **Pull all the way forward** to the Parent Drop Off sign. Do not stop at the front door.
- For the safety of your children and other children, all children are to exit the car curbside.
- Parents should remain in the car while the child exits. If your child cannot exit the car independently, park in the lot and walk your child to the sidewalk.
- **Do not pass cars** that are stopped and in process of dropping off students. When your child has exited your car, you must wait until the car(s) in front of you have completed dropping off their children before you exit the drop off area.
- Do not park between the drop off sign and the orange cones in the morning. This space is designated for continuous traffic flow only.
- It is against the law to pass a bus while the lights are flashing and children are boarding or disembarking the bus

AFTERNOON DISMISSAL

IMPORTANT: Unless a parent is volunteering in the school or already in the school for another reason, no parent is allowed to enter the school to meet his/her child(ren). If a child is to be dismissed, all dismissals must take place at or before 2:30 pm. If not, a parent must wait for a child in the pick-up line or outside the school. Parents of walkers cannot park in the school lot. If you come with a car you must be in the pick-up line. Walkers should leave the school and follow the sidewalk next to the school to the exit onto Cox Street.

If you regularly pick up your child/children at dismissal, 2:55 P.M., you need to follow the procedures described below:

- You will receive a Parent Pick Up (PPU) form that needs to be completed and returned immediately. All PPU children must have a PPU form on file.
- Once School begins, we will provide you with a laminated paper with the last name, as you would like it to appear. Post this on the passenger window when you pick up your child.
- Parents and/or those persons designated by the parents on the PPU form will drive to the rear of the school
- Cars will drive in and line up in single file.
- Proceed to the left to exit. Follow the car in front of you do NOT pass or cut in front of the lead cars.
- Do not call to your child to come to the car.
- Students will be released to parents by staff member on duty who will direct the pick-up.
- Please yield to school buses when approaching the exit.
- Any student remaining after all other cars have departed will go with the teacher on duty to the office. The responsible party will enter the office to pick-up their child.
- If someone other than the regular PPU driver, or one listed on your form, is planning to pick up your child/children, you must notify the school office by **12:00 noon** the same day. The school number is: 978-567-6170 or send in a note on that day with the child.

BICYCLES

- No students have permission to ride their bikes to school unless they have a note on file with the main office.
- Students who bike to school may not arrive before 8:20 a.m.
- A review of the rules of the road pertaining to bicycle safety is conducted by the school each year.
- The children riding their bicycles to school are asked to walk their bicycles on the school grounds to the assigned bicycle parking area and at dismissal from the assigned parking area to the main road
- It is further suggested that a basket or some type of carrier be attached to the child's bicycle to assist in carrying lunch boxes, papers, etc.
- All children are required by Massachusetts law to wear bicycle helmets whenever they are riding their bicycles.
- All bicycles must be locked to one of the school provided bike racks.

VISITING THE SCHOOL

- All visitors and volunteers must sign in at the school office and pick-up a visitor's badge.
- When you sign in, please state the purpose for your visit, your destination and time of arrival and departure.
- Upon your departure, you will need to sign out.
- If you would like to meet with your child's teacher please call in advance to make an appointment.
- All doors will be locked while school is in session.

CORI FORMS

We welcome parent and guardian volunteers to help out with school events however to do so you must compete a CORI (criminal record check) form. These forms can be completed at the schools and can take up to three weeks to process, please plan accordingly. Please see the school secretary for more information.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Students are expected to **attend school daily and arrive on time**. Non-medically documented absences or tardies are not to exceed **14** days. Absences or tardies exceeding this amount are subject to possible interventions by the school. The Massachusetts law regarding school attendance Regulation of School Attendance states: "Every Child between the minimum and maximum ages established for school attendance by the board of education ...shall...attend a public school in said town...during the number of days required by the board of education in each school year. The superintendent, or teachers in so far as authorized by him or by the school committee, may excuse necessary absence for other causes not exceeding seven day sessions in any period of six months."

ABSENCES

Please use the **"Call-Back"** system to notify the school if your child is absent. The purpose of the call back system is to ensure that your child has arrived safely to school. When you call the school to report an absence, please follow the prompts to record your message and include the medical reason for absence if applicable. If possible, please phone the school prior to 30 minutes before the start of the school day. If your child is going to be absent for more than one day, you may either let us know in advance or call each day. In addition to calling, you will need to send in a note indicating the dates and reason for the absence. Parents/guardians are requested to contact the school nurse for absences exceeding two days. A child will be marked absent for the day if s/he arrives at or after 11:45 am.

MISSING CHILD NOTIFICATION

We want to do everything we can to support the safety of your child as they arrive to school. To help us with this effort the school district has established a standard practice in the event that a student does not show up to school and there is no advance notice by a parent. We will follow the steps below:

- Call the home to verify absence.
- If no parent/caregiver or person of authority is reached, we will call other emergency contacts to verify absence or establish a contact with the parent/caregiver.
- If legitimate absence cannot be established, the child should be presumed missing and the police will be contacted.
- We will follow up with the police until the parents/caregiver is reached.
- It is our hope that this process will better ensure the safety and well being of our students.

TARDINESS

School begins at 8:30a.m. **If you drop your child off after the start of school, you are required to escort and sign your child into school.** Excessive tardiness is detrimental to the education of the attending child as well as disruptive to his/her classmates and the classroom teacher. Students who accumulate excessive <u>unexcused</u> tardies will have a notice sent home to their guardian. If a student accrues 10 unexcused tardies, the child's guardian will be required to attend a meeting with the principal or their designee.

EARLY DISMISSAL

Occasionally, because of an appointment, a student must be dismissed before the usual dismissal time. A written request for early dismissal should be turned into the office in the morning. If this is not possible, <u>a phone call at least</u> <u>an hour prior to the end of school</u> will suffice and the pupil will be notified of his early dismissal. Verbal messages from the child are not acceptable. Anyone picking up a student must come into the school to be identified by the student and sign the student out.

DRESS CODE GUIDELINES – ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

Parents and students are expected to exercise good judgment regarding school dress attire. Student attire should not be destructive to school property, comply with requirements for health and safety, and it should not cause disorder or disruption. Some examples are:

- Clothing bearing offensive themes or that advertises merchandise not suitable for minors
- See-through or transparent clothing
- Visible undergarments

Students should also wear appropriate footwear that is conducive to the scheduled activities. Sneakers must be worn in order to participate in physical education. Due to safety concerns, flip-flops and slides may not be worn; all shoes must have a band or back to hold a shoe or sandal in place.

FIELD TRIPS

Teachers are encouraged to partake of the opportunity to take the students on field trips. A parental permission slip is required for each child participating in the trip. Students' safety will be a primary consideration, with first aid kits required on all field trips. A school nurse may accompany students with special health care needs with treatments that cannot be provided by classroom teachers. One or more adults, in addition to the teacher, must accompany each group of thirty or less on any trip unless otherwise approved by the principal. Children need to be academically and behaviorally eligible in order to participate in a field trip, and must behave in accordance with the behavior guidelines of the school while on a field trip. No child shall be denied participation because of lack of economic means.

SCHOOL SAFETY DRILLS

In order to promote a safe school environment, fire and secure building safety drills are conducted throughout the year. Practice drills are both announced and unannounced. If you have concerns as to how your child may respond to such drills, please contact the administration.

AFTERSCHOOL DETENTION

As a consequence for disregard of classroom or school behavioral guidelines, as well as, for missed work, an after school detention may be issued by the teacher or administration. If a detention is issued, parents/guardians will receive notification to plan accordingly and will be responsible for transportation home. Detention generally runs from 3:00-3:30pm

ELECTRONIC DEVICE AND CELL PHONE POLICY

Many of our students have begun carrying cell phones. We understand they are an important means of communication. However, the distraction caused by these phones is increasingly becoming a concern at school. Emergency phone calls can always be made in the front office. Therefore, cell phones are not needed during school hours. If parents need to contact their child, they should call the school office. The office staff is excellent at relaying urgent messages from parents to students. If you receive a call from your child during the school day, please call the school office immediately so that we may assist them.

The regulations of electronic devices (cell phones, mp3 players, radios, iPods, handheld video games, etc.) are as follows:

- Cell phones and electronic devices must be kept out of sight in the students' pockets or backpacks at all times during the school day.
 - This includes the bus rides to and from school, as well as recess.
- Cell phones and electronic devices must be turned off at all times. Students will be considered using a cell phone if the phone rings, vibrates, or the student is looking at or touching it.

Consequences for violation of the regulations regarding the possession and usage of electronic devices include:

- First offense: The electronic device will be confiscated and must be picked up by the parent.
- Second offense: The electronic device will be confiscated and must be picked up by the parent. The student will receive a detention.
- Third offense: The electronic device will be confiscated and must be picked up by the parent. The student will receive a detention.

The privilege to carry a cell phone may be revoked at the discretion of the principal.

We realize that having to pick up a student's cell phone may be inconvenient, and therefore we encourage you to discuss this policy with your child in order to avoid this problem. We also ask you to keep in mind that the use of a cell phone/electronic device is disruptive to the school environment.

BULLYING

Bullying is a serious and hurtful situation that will not be tolerated in our schools. Bullying occurs when more than one time, a student (or students) says, writes or uses physical acts or gestures that are hurtful and target another student. Bullying occurs when

- words, acts, gestures in any combination cause physical or emotional harm to the targeted student or that student's property.
- the targeted student has reason to be afraid of harm to him/herself or of damage to his/her property.
- the repeated behaviors create a hostile environment in school for the targeted student, or when that student's rights are violated.
- the repeated acts disrupt learning and the regular school day in a major way.

Bullying includes cyber-bullying, which is bullying through the use of technology or any electronic communication (for example, emails mobile phone texting and social network pages.).

LIBRARY INFORMATION

While school librarians can offer selection guidance to the students, he or she will not prevent a student from checking out a particular book due to age or reading level. This follows the ALA's *Access to Resources and Services in the School Library* which states that school librarians should **avoid "imposing age, grade-level, or reading-level restrictions on the use of resources"** as well as **avoid "requiring permission from parents or teachers" to check out certain materials.**

In an effort to maintain our school library's collection, we ask that families pay the replacement cost for any **lost** or **damaged** library books. Despite a student's best intentions to keep a library book clean and in a safe place, accidents still happen. After sending in the replacement cost, the librarian will purchase a new copy or similar title for the school library. It is important to note that the library cannot accept just any used children's book to replace the lost library item. The library books have been selected to support the school curriculum and the current needs of the school library. They are also often purchased with hardcovers or special library bindings to make them last longer. You can contact the librarian if you have questions.

MULREADY CARES PROGRAM

The Mulready CARES Program is our positive behavior support program. When children demonstrate the various characteristics (Cooperation, Achievement, Responsibility, Effort, and Safety) they receive a ray. Each month, children from each grade level are randomly chosen from the rays to have lunch with the principal. If a child violates this code of conduct or other school-wide expectations, there are consequences based on the level of the violation.

Mulready CARES Mission Statement:

Our Mission is to develop a school wide positive behavior support plan that will create and enhance a culture where all members of our school community (staff, students, parents, and visitors) exemplify cooperation, achievement, responsibility, effort, and safety.

Mulready Promise:

In order to promote a caring community, we, the students of the Mulready School, promise to demonstrate: Cooperation, Achievement, Responsibility, Effort, and Safety.

C- Cooperation:

- I will work and play appropriately with my fellow students
- I will be kind and help others

A- Achievement:

- I will be a life-long learner and problem solver
- I will work toward accomplishing my goals

R- Responsibility:

- I will take care of my school
- I will be accountable for my actions

2. Approval of Custodians Contract Ratification

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN HUDSON SCHOOL COMMITEE AND HUDSON AFSCME CUSTODIAL ASSOCIATION MAY 2019

The Hudson School Committee ("Committee") and the Hudson AFSCME Custodial Association ("Association") agree to extend their July1, 2016 - June 30, 2019 collective bargaining agreement ("CBA") through June 30, 2022, with the modifications agreed upon in this Memorandum of Agreement ("MOA"). The School Committee and the Association, collectively referred to as the "parties," agree to the following modifications:

1. Amend ARTICLE 10 - TEMPORARY LEAVES 10.1 Sick Leave by: adding the following language as (E):

a) The union and district agree that sick leave is a benefit intended to provide income protection in the event of personal illness. Regular attendance of employees is necessary to carry out the work of Hudson Public Schools. Continuity of service and coverage all rely on the dependability of staff to report to work as scheduled. It is recognized that abuse and/or excessive use of sick time places a hardship on each department and ultimately on student services.

When continued absences or patterns of sick leave occurrences from work suggest an abuse of sick leave, the Employee and the Union shall be notified in writing. After such notification, the Employer may deny sick pay. Continued abuse of sick leave will subject the Employee to progressive discipline.

A pattern of Sick Leave use may be defined as the repeated use of sick days on a particular day or before and/or after scheduled days off, weekends, or holidays, and number of occurrences.

The Superintendent of Schools or designee may require medical certificates.

b) Amend ARTICLE 10 - TEMPORARY LEAVES – Section 10.2 Bereavement Leave: by deleting the first paragraph and replace it with the following language:

Up to a maximum of five (5) days at any one time in the event of the death of an employee's spouse, significant other, child, brother, sister, parent, or immediate member of the employee's household.

Up to a maximum of three (3) days for employee's son-in-law, daughter-in-law, father-in-law, mother-in-law, brother-in-law, and sister-in-law.

The Superintendent or designee may grant up to two (2) additional days for extenuating circumstances. The employee may use other available benefit time (vacation and personnel).

c) Amend ARTICLE 10 - TEMPORARY LEAVES – Section 10.3 Personal and Emergency Leave: by adding the following language:

Effective the 2019-2020 school year one unused personal time off day will be rolled over to personal time off the following school year, the remainder will be converted to sick leave, not to exceed two (2) days. Banked personal time off days will not exceed three (3) in a school year for any bargaining unit member.

d) Amend ARTICLE 10 - TEMPORARY LEAVES – add a Section 10.6 entitled "Parental Leave": by adding the following language:

Parental Leave. A staff member shall be entitled to a leave of absence per state and federal law.

a. A member of the bargaining unit who becomes pregnant shall notify the Human Resources Department in writing approximately sixty (60) calendar days prior to the date the leave is to commence. During said childbearing leave the employee may use her accumulated sick leave for periods of actual disability as a result of the pregnancy.

b. All members of the bargaining unit returning from a maternity leave of absence shall be restored to their previous or similar position with the same status, pay, length of service credit, and seniority as of the date of their leave.

c. The Committee shall recommend to the Town of Hudson that a member of the bargaining unit on maternity leave be allowed to continue being covered under any health or medical insurance applicable to employees, provided that said member pays the full cost thereof.

- 2. Amend ARTICLE 12 CLOTHING Section 12.2 by: deleting \$350 and replacing it with \$500.
- 3. Amend ARTICLE 13 WORK WEEK AND WORK DAY Section 13.1 by: deleting the first, second, third, & fourth paragraph and replace with the following:

The regular workweek shall consist of five (5) consecutive eight (8) hour days, Monday through Friday, inclusive. Each employee shall be assigned to a regular shift. The first shift of eight (8) hours scheduled between 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. or a second-shift of eight (8) hours scheduled between the hours of 12:00 p.m. (noon) to 11:00 p.m. Flexible shift hours may be adjusted to better serve the needs of the district as circumstances may require. A thirty (30) day notice will be given for any permanent shift changes on an individual basis. The district reserves the right to make temporary changes.

a) Amend ARTICLE 13 - WORK WEEK AND WORK DAY - by: adding section 13.6 and inserting the following language:

It shall be a condition of employment that custodial employees are responsible for snow/ice removal to ensure safe access to the schools. The custodian on duty will remove the snow/ice. If in the judgement of the Director of Facilities or its designee, additional custodians are required, off duty custodians will be called and must report for snow/ice removal. Employees may, if in their judgment deem the roads unsafe for travel, may take personal time, if available, and if no personal time is available to that employee, the employee will not be paid for that day. The Director or his designee may deploy manpower to any building based on need.

4. Amend ARTICLE 14 – VACATIONS Section 14.2 (A) by: removing the last sentence of the paragraph and inserting new language:

<u>Remove:</u> All vacation credit earned will be effective on July 1st of the fiscal year following the year in which it is earned.

Insert: Vacation leave will be prorated pursuant to your hire date.

5. Amend ARTICLE 14 – VACATIONS Section 14.2 (E) by: removing the following language:

Ordinarily, vacation leave shall be used only when schools are not in session.

a) Amend ARTICLE 14 – VACATIONS Section 14.2 (E) by: adding the following language prior to the last sentance:

With the exception of unusual circumstances no member of this bargaining group may use extended vacation time two weeks prior to the start of school.

6. Amend ARTICLE 16 – HOLIDAYS – Section 16.1 (A) by: adding the following language:

Christmas Eve holiday - for second shift only

7. Amend ARTICLE 19 - DUES DEDUCTION AND AGENCY FEE Section 19.4 Agency Fee by: removing the following language in the title of the Article:

And Agency Fee

a) Amend ARTICLE 19 - DUES DEDUCTION AND AGENCY FEE Section 19.4 by: removing the following from 19.4 Section Title:

Agency Fee

b) Amend ARTICLE 19 - DUES DEDUCTION AND AGENCY FEE Section 19.4 by: removing the first, second and fifth paragraph:

Subject to all of the terms and conditions of Section 12 of Chapter 150E, the Committee agrees that on or after the one hundred eightieth day following the employment of each new full time or regular part time employee hired after the date of this contract, the payment of a service fee to the Union shall be a condition of employment of such employee.

The Union hereby agrees to the terms and conditions of said Section 12. The Union further agrees to provide the Committee a copy of the rebate procedure referred to in said Section 12 at or before the time of signing this contract and the certificate of a responsible officer of the Union stating the amount of its agency service fee.

The Union agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Committee and/or the Town of Hudson and its officers, agents, and attorneys, as provided in Article 19.5

c) Amend ARTICLE 19 - DUES DEDUCTION AND AGENCY FEE Section 19.4 by: removing and replacing the following language from the third paragraph:

<u>Remove:</u> agency fees and <u>Replace</u> with: dues

7. Amend ARTICLE 20 – WAGES – Section 20.2 Longevity Payments to reflect the following:

After ten (10) years of service but less than fifteen (15):\$600After fifteen (15) years of service but less than twenty (20):\$750After twenty (20) years of service:\$900

a) Amend ARTICLE 20 – WAGES – Section 20.4 (A) by: adding the following language:

In the event the Mail Courier is absent, therefore a need of a temporary employee, the stipend for each day worked will be ten dollars (10).

b) Amend ARTICLE 20 – WAGES – by: adding a new section with the following language:

<u>20.6 Direct Deposit:</u> All members of the bargaining agreement shall accept their paychecks through direct deposit to an account designated by the bargaining unit member. The district will provide guidance for present employees during the process of entering into the Direct Deposit system.

8. <u>Wages</u>: Amend Appendix A to reflect the following increases to the salary schedules set forth in Appendix A:

July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020	1.0%
July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2021	1.0%
July 1, 2021 – June 30, 2022	1.5%

9. Amend ARTICLE 24 - DURATION to reflect that the duration of the collective bargaining agreement shall be from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2022. The first paragraph of Article 24 shall be deleted and replaced with the following language:

This Contract will be in effect as of July 1, 2019 and will continue to remain in full force and effect until June 30, 2022 or until a successor contract has been negotiated, whichever comes later. The Union must notify the Committee no later than March 15, 2022 of its intent to negotiate a new Agreement. Otherwise, this Agreement will automatically be extended for an additional year.

10. <u>Ratification and Approval</u>: This Memorandum of Agreement shall remain off the record for purposes of bargaining history unless and until it is approved by the School Committee and ratified by the membership of the Association. This Memorandum of Agreement is subject to ratification by the Association membership and approval by the School Committee.

11. ADD A NEW APPENDIX ENTITLED "APPENDIX C" as follows: CUSTODIAN CONFIDENTIALITY & NONDISCLOSURE AGREEMENT
